

Newfoundland and Labrador Team and Individual School Chess Championship 2007

Venue: Bishop Abraham Elementary School (See map below)

Date: Saturday, April 21st, 2007.

Time: Registration 9:30 AM to 10:00 AM (Sharp)

Sections: (1) Primary (K-G3) - Combined Team and Individual Section
(2) Elementary (G4 to G6) - Combined Team and Individual Section
(3) Junior High (G7 to G9) - Combined Team and Individual Section
(4) High School (G10 to G12) - Individual Only Section (See below)

Awards: Perpetual trophy for to winner in each of the Individual Championship sections.
Perpetual trophy and School Team banner for winner in each of the Team Championship sections.
Medals for top three places in each section.

Format: 5 rounds Swiss pairing - 30 min. per player. See notes below for details

Entry Fee: \$10.00 per player

For Primary, Elementary and Junior High players, this will be a combined Team and Individual Championship event. Players in these sections will be paired as in an individual tournament using Swiss Pairing. Players will not be paired against players from their own school however except, possibly, in the last round (to decide the individual champions). The School Team scores will be calculated by adding the four highest scores of the players from each school. Note that schools can send as few or as many players as they like.

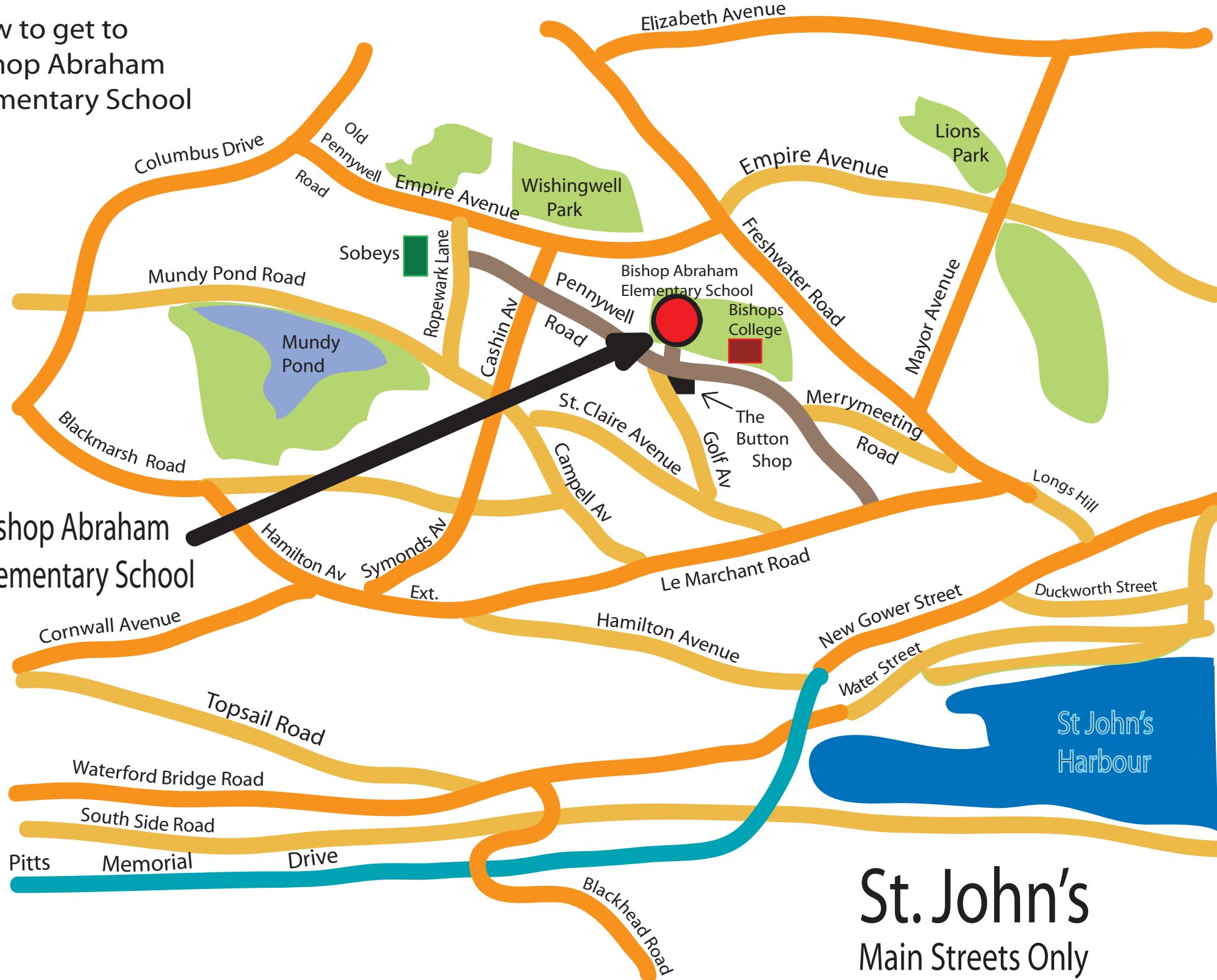
One half point bye may be requested per player for any round except the last round. The request must be made in advance of pairings for the round. Late comers will receive zero point byes for the rounds missed unless a bye was requested in advance. Tie breaker games will be played on the clock with 15 minute per player. In the event that a tie break game is drawn then the result will be decided by speed chess with 5 minutes per player. Tournament director will be Mr. Bob Gregory.

Important Note to Parents:

All tournament participants must be supervised by a parent or designated guardian. Neither the Newfoundland and Labrador School Chess Association (NLSCA) nor the host school will be held responsible for the safety or behaviour of participants not actively engaged in tournament play. The responsibility of the tournament organizers will be limited to ensuring fair competition in accordance with NLSCA tournament rules.
